The PAN IIT – IIT Alumni Program Committee will review each of the proposals carefully and evaluate them based on the specified **CRITERIA** described in the following paragraphs, to rank the proposals received, further review and as a part of the selection process.

We invite you to review these guidelines and expectations, the selection criteria for submitted proposals. An important aspect is to consider this as an exciting and unique opportunity to stand before an enlightened audience and show-case your expertise and help build the brand equity of IIT Alumni.



Please note that the session voted by the participating audience as the most outstanding in all respects, the Track Chair and participating speakers of that session will be recognized with an award for their contributions. The criteria for selecting the best track will be informed in due course.

IMPORTANT DATES:

- 29 Feb 2020: Please advise of your interest to participate and submit a Proposal in response to this "Call for Proposals" by 29 February 2020. Please identify and inform your chosen track / subject area from those identified for the conference. March 31, 2020: Proposal submission deadline: Proposal shall include - Panel Submission Form, Photos of panelists and speaker Release Form 30 April 2020: Proponents notified about the decision of the Program Team. Decision can be "Accepted", "Accepted with some minor changes"; "Accepted with major changes", "Kept as a place holder", "Not Found suitable". June 2020: Session descriptions and speakers/moderators to be re-confirmed And bio profiles, photos to be provided by session proponents.
- **31 July 2020:** Session requirements from conference manager to be confirmed
- September 26, 27: Sessions delivered at the conference.

- Proposals shall be complete in all respects. Incomplete and / or late submissions may not be considered.
- A complete proposal will comprise of:
 - Panel Submission Form
 - Photos of panelists
 - Speaker Release Form



- Proponents are welcome to submit more than one proposal.
- None of the sessions that will be selected will have the same speakers, moderators or chairs.
- Proponents may be individuals limited to a maximum of three persons in a team.
 Diversity of Speakers: The conference is a multi-sectoral, multi-disciplinary event on science, technology, applications and innovation policy issues. A diversity of the panelists is an important criteria for ranking the panels.
- Panels should represent diversity based on gender, sector (government, business, Academia, non-profit etc.), discipline, geography, ethnicity, experience, age and other relevant aspects.
- The empowerment of women in science and innovation enterprise is a core value. Therefore, gender balance and inclusion of qualified female panelists is very important. In addition, it is highly recommended to include the millennial and young emerging scientists and engineers, other specialists and startup entrepreneurs as panelists.
- Please note that 'all- male" panels may have a reduced chance of acceptance.
- Corporations interested in sponsoring a session are welcome. In such cases proposals must be submitted by the corporation / IIT Alumni and/or their spouse as a proponent. Details of sponsorship opportunities will be discussed on a case-by-case basis.
- Quality of the proposed session: In terms of the experience and expertise and past record in participation in similar conferences and events will be an important criterion for selection. Some metrics for consideration and that would be used for a Qualitative evaluation of the proposals are as follows:
- Content and Topic:
 - Timely and relevant to Canada and USA
 - Panelists are recognized experts and have a deep comprehension and experience in the proposed subject matter of the track session
 - Appropriate justification and a rationale for selection of the speakers as panelists.
- Speakers:
 - Knowledge and experience
 - Ability to garner public attention
 - Experience and involvement in technological aspects, policy and planning of knowledge economy in Canada and internationally
- Delivery:
 - Communication ability and strategies



- Creative and innovative format, and interactivity of the session with audience.
- The language for the sessions is English.

• Panel Readness

Sessions with confirmed speakers will precede in rankings as compared to those with Proposed or just invited and un-confirmed speakers.

• Alignment with the conference objectives:

- Ability to forge strong linkages, create professional networks amongst participants and stakeholders
- Create a platform for the participants to interact, innovate and shape the future of a knowledge driven economy.
- Provide a supportive environment for innovative ideas and projects, encourage further collaborations across sectors.

• Alignment with the conference themes:

Sessions should fall under one or have an overlapping edge with more than one theme of those of the conference. As examples, experts can provide specific cases and experiences consistent with the themes to support their remarks and translate those details into more transferable lessons and best practices.

• Alignment with panel format (streams):

- Length of the sessions shall be strictly as defined in the Program Template.
- The "Call for Proposals" is limited to the "Break-out Sessions" only. Plenary sessions are not included in this "Call for Proposals".
- There is no provision for compensation for any costs associated with the proposal preparation, moderator, speakers etc.
- Please clearly indicate the audio visual and projection systems and any other requirements
- Invited speakers interested in giving a special demo of their products will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

REWARDS AND RECOGNITION FOR PROPONENTS:

- Proponents of proposals that are finally selected and delivered at the conference will be recognized at the conference.
- Two complimentary registrations for each selected proposal will be awarded for all days of the conference and the VIP dinner.
- The proponent and speaker + moderator team of the track session voted as the Best Track Session of the conference will receive a special "Best Track" recognition.
